Sport Premium Funding 2017/18

Current numbers on roll = 266

Number of children in Reception and years 1 – 6 who are **eligible** for Sport Premium on the October 2017 School Census = **228**

Funding received: £18220 (including sugar tax, plus £5 per pupils aged 5-11 years old)

Background:

The Government have provided funding of £150 million for Physical Education (PE) and sport to schools. This funding should be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision. The funding is for the period 1 September 2017 – 31 August 2018. This funding is ring fenced to be used for sport specific areas to make a sustainable impact in Physical Education and Sport in schools.

Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and Sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

During the academic year September 2017 to August 2018 we plan to spend our funding in the following areas:

- Comprehensive package purchased from the Hunts School Sports Partnership*
- Training for EYFS teachers in content, delivery and expectations through Rugby
- Training of teachers and other school staff across a range of sports and sporting activities
- PE Coordinator and Sports Coach monitoring and assessment activities
- Purchase of replacement/new resources to support physical education in school
- Training of sports leaders to run lunch time activities and to help further the use of intra school Competitions throughout KS1 and KS2 to enhance competition opportunities
- Purchase of equipment and trophies/medals to enhance interest in competitions
- Provide transport to sports competitions/festivals events throughout the school year
- Outdoor PA system for Skip to be fit
- EYFS new equipment (trikes and bikes)
- New gymnastic mats
- New tyre park KS1
