Dear Parents and Carers,

Please find attached the updated risk assessment measures as promised to you last week. Please note that this may be subject to change in line with guidance from the Local Authority and TDET. If this is the case, I will update you in a timely manner.

We will be expecting all children back into school from Monday the 8<sup>th</sup> March when children will return to their own classes and classrooms as they were during the Autumn term. The school will continue to operate in 4 separate bubbles as follows:

- Blue – EYFS
- Green – Key Stage 1
- Orange – Years 3 and 4
- Pink – Years 5 and 6

Details relating to drop off and collection points are contained within the risk assessment.

We will be working hard in school to implement all of the safety measures and maintain the integrity of the school bubbles. Please read the attached documents carefully to ensure that you understand them and remind your children about the expectations and their responsibilities. If you have children who travel to and from school without an adult, it is particularly important to remind them of their responsibilities in relation to social distancing and ensuring they make their journeys directly to school and then home again.

Staff will continue to carry out LFD tests twice per week and we expect all families to report cases/suspected cases of COVID-19 to us at the earliest opportunity. Nobody displaying symptoms is permitted to enter the school site and where positive cases with direct contact are identified, there is the possibility school bubbles will have to close. If this happens, we will inform you at the earliest opportunity and revert to our home learning, which you are hopefully very familiar with now.

Our plans for the 3 weeks leading up to the Easter break will be to get the children settled in their classes, then start to assess their learning needs. Some of our children will have been out of school for 11 weeks when they return and may need a period of adjustment. Please liaise closely with your child's teacher if you have any concerns. We hope to conduct parent consultations early in the Summer term.

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Continued:-

We will continue to work closely with you to ensure that children make a safe and happy transition back into school but please do not hesitate to contact us if you have any queries or concerns. We hope that this is the final lockdown but so much is still dependent on us fully implementing the risk assessment measures and following guidance. I have said it many times before, but we should be proud of what we have achieved to this point and I am certain that we will continue to do what is right and best for our children so that they can get back to enjoying their learning and being with their friends.

We can't wait to see them all back again on 8<sup>th</sup> March but in the meantime please do get in touch with any questions.
