Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope this finds you well and that you enjoyed your Father's Day celebrations at the weekend. I was delighted to be able to see my own Father on Sunday for the first time in a long time, although it felt strange to maintain social distancing when what I really wanted to do was give him a big bear hug! Harriet was delighted to see Grandad again but was seriously unimpressed with his lockdown beard!

It has been another very busy week in many ways, and we are starting to see announcements from Government about further easing of lockdown measures over the coming weeks and months. We are delighted to hear that the government is aiming for all pupils to be back to school in September, however we remain cautious and look forward to further guidance about what this will actually look like in school and what safety measures we will need to keep in place to ensure this is successful. As always, the safety and well-being of children and staff will be our highest priority and we will communicate any plans or important information as soon as we can.

School is currently very calm and happy. All the children who have returned are settled and enjoying their days with us. We have reviewed our provision this week and have some important updates for you.

#### **Keyworker places**

With the current arrangements in place, we are not able to offer any further keyworker places in school. All bubbles are full to their maximum capacity. We plan to review this again next week and there may be a possibility that we could increase the size of the bubbles from 6<sup>th</sup> July, thus admitting further keyworker children in very small numbers. We will write to you next week to provide further information and apologise if this causes you any difficulties.

### **EYFS and Year 1**

We have a limited number of spaces available in our EYFS and Year 1 bubbles and would ask you to complete <u>this form</u> by no later than **12 noon on Friday 25<sup>th</sup> June** if you would like to request a place for the following week. Please note that if your child is allocated a place, they will be expected to be in school full time from Monday 29<sup>th</sup> June until the end of term. We will contact you on Friday afternoon to inform you which bubble they have been placed in and provide further details. If you would like to request a place and have difficulty completing the form or you would like to discuss your child's return to school, please contact the School Office.

#### Year 6

Following our survey to Year 6 parents last week, we have 28 children who would like the opportunity to come into school to meet with a small group of friends and their teachers before the end of term. The Year 6 team are in the process of planning and risk assessing these visits and will contact Year 6 parents separately with details of all the arrangements. It is likely that you will receive this communication next week and visits will be planned for the last week of term.

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### Heatwave Alert Level 2

The Met Office has issued a Level 2 Heatwave alert indicating an 80% risk of meeting trigger temperatures across the East of England between 0900 Wednesday and 0900 on Friday.
